ORDER OF IMPAIRMENT

It appearing to the Board that Judge Charles E. Poston of the Circuit Court of the City of Norfolk entered an order on August 26, 2008, finding that Marshall T. Bohannon, Jr. is suffering from an Impairment as defined in Part 6, Section IV, Paragraph 13 (A) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia and Section 37.1 of the Code of Virginia and appointed a guardian and conservator of his person;


Pursuant to Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13.I.6.d. of the Rules of the Virginia Supreme Court, it is hereby **ORDERED** that Marshall T. Bohannon, Jr.'s license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia is suspended upon entry of this Order; and

It is further **ORDERED** that Marshall T. Bohannon, Jr. give notice by certified mail of the suspension of his license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia to all clients for whom he is currently handling matters and to all opposing attorneys and to presiding judges in pending litigation, and he shall further make appropriate arrangements for the disposition of any matters presently in his care in conformity with the wishes of his clients., pursuant to the Rules of the Virginia Supreme Court, Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13.M; and
