CONSENT ORDER FOR IMPAIRMENT SUSPENSION

This day came the Virginia State Bar (“VSB”), by Assistant Bar Counsel, Anastasia K. Billy; Respondent, Johnda Denise Scott (“Respondent”); and Marvin D. Miller, counsel for Respondent, and represented to the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board (“Board”) that Respondent suffers from an Impairment that materially impairs Respondent’s ability to practice law. The VSB and Respondent, with review and consent by Respondent’s counsel, submitted a Joint Petition to the Board for an Impairment Suspension.

WHEREAS, Respondent has, with the advice and consent of counsel, by this Consent Order agreed that she suffers from an Impairment, as defined in Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Respondent has represented, and Respondent’s counsel has concurred, that Respondent had already withdrawn from the active practice of law as of March 4, 2015, and in particular, that Respondent had no pending cases in any court, and was no longer engaged in representing any clients, as of that date; and

WHEREAS, Respondent has, with the advice and consent of counsel, by this Consent Order agreed that, pursuant to the rules of Court, Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13-23.A, Respondent shall be suspended from the practice of law in the Commonwealth of Virginia because she has an Impairment, and that the term of Respondent’s suspension

shall be indefinite, and, except as provided at Paragraph 13-23, shall be terminated only upon determination by the Board that Respondent no longer suffers from the Impairment; and

WHEREAS, Respondent, with the advice and consent of counsel, agrees that any petition seeking to terminate her Impairment suspension shall be expressly conditioned upon, and shall have as a condition precedent, proof from Respondent that in the event any claims are paid by the Virginia State Bar Client Protection Fund in matters involving her, she has reimbursed the Virginia State Bar Client Protection Fund in full for all such claims; and

WHEREAS the instant proceeding is a private and confidential matter, no professionals' findings will be released by the VSB to the public; and

WHEREAS, it appearing proper to do so under Paragraph 13-23, and by consent of Respondent, by counsel:

1. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the license of Johnda Denise Scott to practice law in Commonwealth of Virginia is SUSPENDED indefinitely.
2. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Respondent shall not be required to separately comply with the requirements of Paragraph 13-29, as she has already provided to the VSB a certification that she had no pending cases in any court, and was no longer engaged in representing any clients, as of March 4, 2015.
2. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that any petition seeking to terminate Respondent's Impairment suspension shall be expressly conditioned upon, and shall have as a condition precedent, proof from Respondent that in the event any claims are paid by

the Virginia State Bar Client Protection Fund in matters involving her, she has reimbursed the Virginia State Bar Client Protection Fund in full for all such claims.




