ORDER OF SUSPENSION

ON THE 10th day of May, 2010, the Virginia Supreme Court issued a mandate directing the Three-Judge Court to enter an Order fixing the effective date of the appellant's suspension, and to set forth the date that he shall comply with the provisions of Part VI, Section IV, Paragraph 13-29 of the Rules of Court.

It is ORDERED that the Respondent's license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia will be suspended for a period of eighteen (18) months, effective June 25, 2010; and

It is further ORDERED that the Respondent must comply with the requirements of Part Six, § IV, ¶ 13-29 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia. The Respondent shall forthwith give notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, of the suspension of his license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia, to all clients for whom he is currently handling matters and to all opposing attorneys and presiding judges in pending litigation. The Respondent shall also make appropriate arrangements for the disposition of matters then in his care in conformity with the wishes of his client. Respondent shall give such notice within 14 days of the effective date of the suspension, and make such arrangements as are required herein within 45 days of the effective date of the suspension. The Respondent shall also furnish proof to the Bar within 60 days of the effective day of the suspension that such notices have been timely given and such arrangements made for the disposition of matters.

It is further ORDERED that if the Respondent is not handling any client matters on the effective date of suspension, he shall submit an affidavit to that effect to the Clerk of the Disciplinary System at the Virginia State Bar. All issues concerning the adequacy of the notice and arrangements required by Paragraph 13-29 shall be determined by the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board, unless the Respondent makes a timely request for hearing before a three-judge court.

It is further ORDERED that the Respondent shall furnish true copies of all of the notice letters sent to all persons notified of the suspension, with the original return receipts for said notice letters, to the Clerk of the Disciplinary System, on or before August 24, 2010.

It is further ORDERED that the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Arlington County, Virginia, shall send four (4) certified copies of this Order to the Clerk of Disciplinary System of the Virginia State Bar at 707 East Main Street, Suite 1500, Richmond, Virginia 23219-2800, and a copy to David Loren Shurtz, 730 North Glebe Road, Arlington, Virginia 22203, and to Michael Rigsby, Forest Plaza II, Suite 310, 7275 Glen Forest Drive, Richmond, Virginia, 23226, and to Kathleen M. Uston, Assistant Bar Counsel, Virginia State Bar, 707 East Main Street, Suite 1500, Richmond, Virginia 23219-2800.
