1. I was licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia on January 6, 1997;
2. I submit this Affidavit Declaring Consent to Revocation pursuant to Rule of Court, Part 6, Section IV, Paragraph 13-28.
3. My consent to revocation is freely and voluntarily rendered, I am not being subjected to coercion or duress, and I am fully aware of the implications of consenting to the revocation of my license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia;
4. I am aware that there is currently pending a complaint, an investigation into, or a proceeding involving, allegations of misconduct, the docket number for which is set forth above, and the specific nature of which is here set forth:

The Virginia State Bar is investigating the disbarment by consent of Mr. Solomon in Maryland following an investigation involving his receipt of funds and failure to maintain those funds pursuant to fiduciary duties.

5. I acknowledge that the material facts upon which the allegations of misconduct are predicated are true; and
6. I submit this Affidavit and consent to the revocation of my license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia because I know that if the disciplinary proceedings based on


the said alleged misconduct were brought or prosecuted to a conclusion, I could not successfully defend them.

Maryland, and it is further,


ORDERED, that the Clerk of this Court shall strike the name of Richard G.

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**JOINT PETITION FOR DISBARMENT BY CONSENT**

The Attorney Grievance Commission of Maryland, by Petitioner, Glenn M. Grossman, Bar Counsel, and Gail D. Kessler, Assistant Bar Counsel, its attorneys and the Respondent, Richard G. Solomon, by his attorney, Robert C. Bonsib, Esquire, petition this Honorable Court for an Order disbarring the Respondent from the practice of law, and state as follows:

1. Respondent was admitted to the Bar of Maryland on December 1, 1986.
2. Respondent is also admitted to the Bars of Virginia, District of Columbia, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.
3. There is presently pending investigations involving three separate complaints. In one of those matters, the investigation involves Respondent's receipt of funds and his failure to maintain those funds pursuant to his fiduciary duties. This conduct implicates Rules 1.1, 1.15 and 8.4(d) of the Maryland Rules of Professional Conduct.

4. By Respondent's attached Affidavit, he waives his procedural rights and consents to disbarment. Petitioner Respondent requests this Court disbar Respondent, Richard G. Solomon.


WHEREFORE, the parties pray this Honorable Court to:

Esquire, in the above-referenced matter, states to the Court as follows:

1. I was admitted to the Bar of Maryland on December 1, 1986.
2. I am also admitted to the Bars of Virginia, District of Columbia, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.
3. I understand that there is presently pending against me, three separate complaints. The professional misconduct alleged is that I received funds and failed to maintain those funds pursuant to my fiduciary duties. In violation of Rules 1.1, 1.15 and 8.4(d) of the Maryland Rules of Professional Conduct.
4. My consent to disbarment is freely and voluntarily rendered, pursuant to the provisions of Maryland Rule 16-772(b)(2), and I am not being subject

to coercion or duress.

5. I am fully aware of the implications of submitting my consent to disbarment.
6. I submit my consent to disbarment without admitting or denying the allegations because I know that if a hearing were to be held, sufficient evidence could be produced to sustain the allegations of misconduct.
7. I agree to comply with the requirements of Maryland Rule 16-760.
8. I do hereby CONSENT TO DISBARMENT by the Court of Appeals of Maryland.
