

Debate on Religious Freedom in the Workplace: Freedom Of Religion versus Freedom From Religion?

A clerk of court is jailed for her refusal to issue marriage licenses to same-sex couples against her Christian religious convictions. What justifies the use of criminal contempt in such cases? A DMV office is sued to allow a woman to wear a colander on her head for her photo based on her Pastafarian religion. Should this be actionable? Our distinguished panelists will debate whether conscience clause legislation is an appropriate protection of an individual's right to act on religious beliefs or is condonation of intentional discrimination and discuss what constitutes reasonable religious accommodations in the workplace.

Professor Douglas Laycock, *School of Law, University of Virginia, Charlottesville.* /

Douglas Laycock is the Robert E. Scott Distinguished Professor of constitutional law at the University of Virginia School of Law, and one of the nation's leading authorities on the law of remedies and the law of religious liberty. He wrote an amicus brief in the *Hobby Lobby* case on behalf of a coalition of groups led by the Christian Legal Society. Professor Laycock is vice president of the American Law Institute, a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the 2009 winner of the National First Freedom Award from the Council on America's First Freedom.

Claire Guthrie Gastanaga, *Executive Director, American Civil Liberties Union of Virginia, Richmond.* / Ms. Gastanaga has led the ACLU of Virginia since 2012. Prior to joining the ACLU of Virginia, she served in the Virginia Attorney General's Office for eight years and was the first woman to serve as Virginia's Chief Deputy Attorney General. She has argued cases in the Virginia and United States Supreme Courts, and has served as a senior advisor to the leadership of the Virginia General Assembly holding positions including Chief of Staff and Counsel to the Speaker of the Virginia House. Ms. Gastanaga is a 2015 Fellow of the Virginia Law Foundation.

Lori Windham, *The Becket Fund for Religious Liberty, Washington D.C.* / Ms. Windham is Senior Counsel at the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty. She has extensive litigation experience representing a variety of religious groups at every level from the district courts to the Supreme Court. Her work has included cases under the Free Exercise Clause, Establishment Clause, RFRA, RLUIPA, and state religious freedom laws. Ms. Windham regularly appears in national media to speak about her cases, including appearances on CBS, CNN, Fox News, MSNBC, and other outlets.

Joan McKenna, *LeClair Ryan, Richmond.* / Ms. McKenna's practice includes the representation of employers in a variety of employment lawsuits, including suits under Title VII, the ADEA, the ADA and state fair employment laws. She also represents employers in administrative proceedings and advises employers regarding compliance with various employment-related state and federal laws. She speaks regularly to employers on various topics in employment law and has served as a contributing editor to the *Virginia Employment Law Letter*. Ms. McKenna is the President Elect of the Virginia Women Attorneys Association.

Moderator

Timothy J. Heaphy, *Hunton and Williams LLP, Washington, D.C. and Richmond.* / Mr. Heaphy is chair of Hunton & William's white collar defense and internal investigation's practice. Prior to joining the firm, he was the United States Attorney for the Western District of Virginia. He has testified before Congressional committees several times on issues ranging from guns to synthetic drugs to sentencing reform. Mr. Heaphy is a 2016 Fellow of the Virginia Law Foundation and serves on the Board of Governors of the State Bar's Criminal Law Section.




