

Fairfax Attorney Named VSB President-Elect

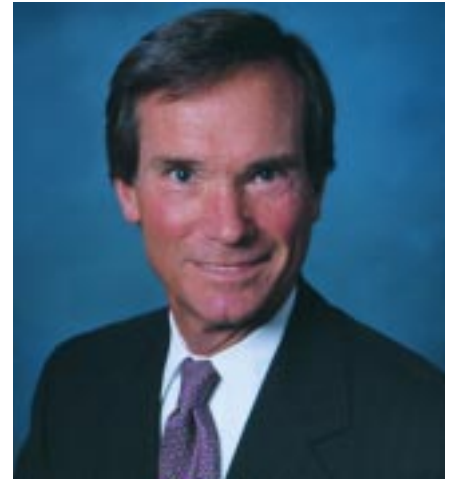
David P. Bobzien, the Fairfax County Attorney, has been named president-elect of the Virginia State Bar for the 2003-2004 term.

Bobzien is a member of the VSB council, executive committee and the VSB budget and finance committee. He is also the executive committee's representative on the Virginia Law Foundation Committee on Continuing Legal Education.

Bobzien is a past president and current board member of the Fairfax Bar Foundation, a past president of the Local Government Attorneys of Virginia and a past chair of the VSB local government law section.

A 1968 graduate of Holy Cross College, Bobzien received his law degree in 1971 from the University of Virginia's law school. He received an LL.M. in taxation from George Washington University while serving as an army judge advocate general. Bobzien was engaged in private practice and then worked in the Justice Department's Office of Professional Responsibility. He was appointed chairman of the Fairfax County Goals Commission and a member of the Fairfax County Planning Commission, where he served until he was appointed the Fairfax County Attorney in 1993.

Bobzien will succeed Jeannie P. Dahnk, who was installed as the 65th president of



the Virginia State Bar on June 20 at the bar's annual meeting in Virginia Beach.
