DISABILITY SUSPENSION ORDER

This day came the Bar, by Assistant Bar Counsel Richard E. Slaney, and the Respondent, Timothy Everett Miller, Esq. (Mr. Miller), individually and by his counsel, J. Edgar Demps, Esq., and represented to the Disciplinary Board of the Virginia State Bar that Mr. Miller currently is suffering from clinical depression to the extent he has taken disability leave from his employment as the Public Defender for the City of Suffolk. As such, Mr. Miller currently suffers from an Impairment, as that term is defined in Part 6, Section IV, Paragraph 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia (Paragraph 13), and his license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia should be suspended under Paragraph 13(I)(6) until it is established he no longer suffers from an Impairment.

It appearing proper to do so under Paragraph 13(I)(6), it is hereby ORDERED that the license of Timothy Everett Martin to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia is SUSPENDED indefinitely.

It is further ORDERED that the Respondent shall comply with the requirements of Paragraph 13(M) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia. Issues concerning the adequacy of the notice and arrangements required shall be determined by the Board, which may impose a sanction of revocation or further suspension for failure to comply with the requirements of this

paragraph.




