

VIRGINIA: IN THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR THE CITY OF CHARLOTTESVILLE

IN RE: CLOSING OF THE CLERK'S OFFICE FOR THE MOVE TO ITS
TEMPORARY LOCATION DURING COURTHOUSE RENOVATIONS

The Clerk's Office for the Charlottesville Circuit Court will move to its temporary location the week of December 31st, 2018. The Court finds that numerous people will be involved in conducting the move and it is not feasible to conduct security screenings of the employees of the moving company when entering the building.

The Court, pursuant to Section 17.1-207 subsection 3 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, hereby ORDERS that the Clerk's office be closed on Wednesday, January 2nd, 2019, Thursday, January 3rd, 2019, and Friday, January 4th, 2019. Under prevailing conditions of the move to its temporary location, operations of the Clerk's Office on said days constitute a threat to the health and safety of the Clerk's Office personnel and the general public.

The Clerk's Office will reopen for regular business on Monday, January 7th, 2019. Pursuant to Section 17.1-207 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, closing of the Clerk's Office pursuant to this Section shall have the same effect as provided in Section 1-210 subsection B of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.
