CONSENT ORDER OF IMPAIRMENT SUSPENSION

WHEREAS the Virginia State Bar, by Deputy Bar Counsel, has caused an Impairment investigation to be opened before the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board against John Fredrick McGarvey (“Respondent”) on the basis that the bar has reason to believe that Respondent is suffering from an Impairment as defined in Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia; and

WHEREAS the Disciplinary Board has appointed Paul D. Georgiadis, Esquire, as guardian *ad litem* for Respondent, and Mr. Georgiadis has met with Respondent and discovered what Mr. Georgiadis and Deputy Bar Counsel believe to be clear and convincing evidence of Respondent’s Impairment; and

WHEREAS Respondent and Mr. Georgiadis, as guardian *ad litem*, consent to the entry of an order suspending Respondent’s license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia on the basis that Respondent has an Impairment as that term is defined in Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia; and

WHEREAS Respondent acknowledges and represents that he is suffering from an Impairment as that term is defined in Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia and that, as a result of this Impairment, Respondent has ceased practicing law for the present time; and

WHEREAS at a hearing of this matter conducted on February 17, 2017, Mr. Georgiadis shared with the Disciplinary Board evidence supporting a finding of Impairment, the Disciplinary Board hereby finds that Respondent suffers from an Impairment as that term is defined in Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia and that the underlying condition materially impairs Respondent's fitness to practice law.


Based on the forgoing and the consent of Respondent, Mr. Georgiadis, and the bar, and it otherwise appearing just and proper to do so, it is hereby ORDERED, pursuant to Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13-23 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia, that Respondent John Fredrick McGarvey's license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia shall be and hereby is SUSPENDED indefinitely upon entry of this Order due to Impairment and shall remain suspended until it is established that he no longer suffers from an Impairment.

It is further ORDERED that Respondent shall give notice, by certified mail, of the suspension of his license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia to all clients for whom he is currently handling matters and to all opposing attorneys and presiding judges in pending litigation, and shall make appropriate arrangements for the disposition of any matters presently in his care in conformity with the wishes of his clients, pursuant to the requirements of Part Six, Section IV, Paragraph 13-29 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia.




