Facts about the Justice Gap in Virginia

- The Justice Gap has been defined as the difference between the level of legal assistance available and the level that is necessary to meet the needs of poor Americans.
- Over 80 percent of the civil legal needs of the poor in Virginia and nationwide go unmet.
- Individuals who are represented by counsel are twice as likely to have a favorable outcome versus those who are unrepresented.
- One in eight Virginians (approximately one million Virginians) is eligible for free legal services from Virginia's legal aid programs; however, there are not enough legal aid lawyers to provide representation – fewer than 140 legal aid lawyers.
- There is one legal aid lawyer per 7,237 poor people in Virginia vs. one lawyer per 349 Virginians.
